




### Orange Class

### Green Class' Scooter Training

Green class completed a very frosty scooter training on Thursday. They learned to: scoot slowly and sensibly, look where you are going, be polite and share the pavement, stop well before the kerb and walk (don't scoot) across the road. They remembered the 4 Cs: Careful, Concentrate, Control and Considerate. Well done Green!













**Blue Class Science - String Telephone** Blue Class enjoyed making a string telephone to explore how sounds travel over a distance. When one person talks into their cup it vibrates. The sound energy of these vibrations passes along the string quickly because it is a solid object where the particles are close together. The vibrations then pass from the string into the second cup, which also vibrates. These vibrations pass through the air particles into the second person's ear, who can hear the first person's voice – well done!





**Violet Class Science - Thermal Conductivity** Violet Class enjoyed investigating which materials were the most insulating. They made predictions, wrapped plastic cups in different materials (felt, bubble wrap, foil, plastic, tissue paper and cotton wool), poured warm water into each cup and measured the temperature at 10-minute intervals. Violet identified that cotton wool and foil were the best insulators, shortly followed by bubble wrap and felt. We discussed that these materials were more insulating because they conducted heat poorly and were filled with tiny air spaces. Violet also learnt that Insulation reduces the movement of energy in either direction – well done!









**Blue Class' netball match** Blue class girls played netball against Twickenham Prep School last Friday and were extremely impressive. Well done Blue Class.


