

Blue Class Science - Mirror Magic

Blue Class enjoyed exploring different mirrors to develop their understanding of light reflecting from surfaces. They looked at their reflection in a plane mirror, which they noticed looked back to front. We also talked about 'AMBULANCE' being written in reverse on its bonnet so it can be read clearly in a car mirror. Blue also looked in a concave mirror, where their reflection was upside down as well as a convex mirror, which was less clear and made them look wider. We then taped two plane mirrors together and created colourful patterns. When Blue opened and closed these mirrors, they noticed that the smaller angle made the pattern look larger and the larger angle made the pattern look smaller. It was explained that this is how a kaleidoscope makes different patterns. Finally, Blue created symmetrical patterns using a single line of symmetry – well done for being scientists, mathematicians and artists!























We are delighted that Camp Beaumont will be returning to run holiday clubs here at Unicorn in the Easter holidays
