This visit was arranged to enhance our learning about Classifying Animals. It was absolutely brilliant and Ranger Stu was so interesting and funny. One of the things Miss Botes learnt is that scorpions are visible under ultra violet light - they glow bright blue!













# NEWS FROM 'THE POT OF GOLD'




**Multisensory Learning Activities** Have you ever made up a rhyme or used different colours to help you memorise something? If you have, then you know a bit about multisensory learning. It's a way of using more than one of our senses to give the brain multiple pathways to learn and recall knowledge. Whilst this kind of learning is beneficial for all children, research indicates that teaching which integrates visual, auditory, tactile and kinaesthetic activities is particularly effective for those with different learning needs.

Kinaesthetic comes from the Greek 'kenein' to move and this week, I want to show 3 activities from the Pot of Gold which combine movement with other senses to create a multisensory learning experience for the children.

 Some words are really difficult to spell so saying the sounds or letters while stepping on them can be really helpful. I use footsteps for this activity but pieces of paper would be fine. You could try putting them on the stairs to give even more movement to the activity!



Writing some individual letters needs more practice than others so saying them while writing them with arms outstretched, either on a surface such as an easel or in the air, develops their motor memory. Try with eyes closed too!





3 Combining the kinaesthetic with the tactile sense provides another route for remembering visual information and writing in a sand tray always goes down well. You could try using a baking tray with salt – fun but not tasty!
