Orange Class' 'Growing and Changing' topic

To enrich our 'Growing and Changing' topic, we've set up a greenhouse in our role-play area! We've planted 3 types of seeds, cress, French beans, and nasturtiums, and are eagerly awaiting their germination.

Violet Class Science - Elephant's Toothpaste experiment Violet Class carried out the Elephant's Toothpaste experiment by mixing yeast and warm water with hydrogen peroxide, washing-up liquid, and food colouring. When the yeast was added, the mixture foamed up and overflowed, resembling toothpaste being squeezed from a giant tube.

This dramatic reaction showed that a chemical change had occurred. A new substance (foam) was created, and the bottle became warm, indicating an exothermic reaction. The yeast helped break down the hydrogen peroxide, releasing oxygen gas, which got trapped in the soap to form foam.

The children recorded the experiment using iPads and reviewed the footage in slow motion. They concluded that this was an irreversible change, as the original materials could not be separated again.

TypeQuest



Touch typing holiday and weekend courses for children and teenagers at Richmond College

Learn to touch-type during your holidays. TypeQuest offers fun and engaging courses for children and teenagers aged 7+, 12+, and 16+ in your local area.

Touch Typing is the skill of finding the keys of the keyboard with the sense of sight rather than looking for the keys. Once touch typing becomes automated, the learner will be able to focus on other aspects of their work. Touch typing is a great life skill for all, it is particularly beneficial to children with dyslexia, dysgraphia and other handwriting-related learning needs. We use the latest touch typing software in our courses, and as part of the course, the learner will be issued with a software licence. With this licence, the user will be able to log into their profile from any device and from any location.

Why learn to touch type?

Touch Typing is fun and quick to learn. It is a fantastic life skill with measurable advantages for further education and beyond. Learning a new skill will boost confidence and self-esteem in children. Pupils will be able to produce twice the amount of work in less time. Typing becomes more accurate, and less time is spent on editing.

Being able to touch type frees the brain to focus on other aspects of work, like content and creativity. It will help children with dyslexia and other handwriting-related learning needs. It will help to produce legible and presentable work.
