

We took part in fun activities in the woods and had a great time pond dipping, discovering all sorts of pond life. We also got a sneak peek at the dormitory we might stay in next year. It was a brilliant trip full of excitement and adventure!



In French lessons this term, **Green Class** have been learning about the French names of fruits and vegetables. They finished off the topic with a taste test - saying which ones they liked and didn't like.







Yellow Class went to LEGOLAND and loved everything about it. Some of our highlights were going on boats around Fairy-tale Brook, catching the train around town where some of us got wet! Watching a 4D show about a lost unicorn was magical and fun, we couldn't believe how realistic everything was in 4D and also enjoyed the welcome break from all of the running, high excitement and sun. We rushed to a fun workshop about castles and all learnt how to build fabulously strong castles. We finished off our day exploring Mini Land and spotting some famous castles and landmarks. Blue Class Science Blue Class explored the materials inside a disposable nappy, discovering plastic, cotton, elastic, mesh fabric, and absorbent crystals. They then asked thoughtful questions about nappy performance, such as absorbency and elasticity. To investigate scientifically, Blue chose to use fair and comparative tests along with research – well done!





Indigo Class Science - How strong is a shape? - STEM challenge

We explored which 3D shape makes the strongest column. We made three different shapes: a cylinder, a cuboid, and a triangular prism.

Before testing, we made predictions about which shape would be the strongest. Then we tested each one by stacking books on top until the shape collapsed.

The results were exciting. The cylinder was the strongest - it held the most books! Next came the triangular prism, and the cuboid was the weakest. We learned that corners can make shapes weaker, while curved sides like the cylinder help spread the weight more evenly.

It was a fun way to learn how shapes work in real life - just like in buildings and bridges.







Violet Class Science Inflating a balloon - Chemical reactions in action

Violet had a blast exploring science by inflating a balloon using a simple chemical reaction between baking soda and vinegar. When these two substances combine, they produce carbon dioxide gas - a fizzy reaction that's perfect for balloon fun!

We carefully stretched the balloon over the neck of the bottle, letting it hang to the side, so the baking soda stayed inside the balloon. Once everything was in place, we lifted the balloon, allowing the baking soda to fall into the vinegar below. Instantly, bubbles began to form, and the balloon started to inflate - like magic, but all thanks to science!

Violet class played matches against Old Vicarage School on Monday and won Fantastic effort all round. Well done team Unicorn.






